

How books are chosen in the library

(Reference District Policy 2310)



Student or Staff
Requested/Recommended



Recommended by Literary Publishing Group (Junior Library Guild, Titlewave, etc)





Books are reviewed by Librarian/Qualified Staff Member (English Teacher, Admin, etc).







If the book does not meet enough criteria to be circulated, it will be returned or donated If deemed suitable for general population, it is processed and put into circulation

If a book contains mature themes, it is recommended to committee to determine literary merit





If the book is recommended by committee to be retained, it is marked as restricted use or for the general population



Students with parental permission in the form of a waiver or e-mail from parent can access books on the restricted use list

## **Book Referral for Review**

Book Referral for Review

(Reference District Policy 2314



Parent/Student recommendation for a book review because of mature content, or to suggest being place in General circulation



Request is formally submitted using Referral Form

(District Policy 2314f)



A committee is formed consisting of the librarian, the principal, appropriate subject specialist from the school, and the curriculum director/curriculum committee to determine the text's literary merit with 3 outcomes:









Book can be removed based on committee decision\*

Book can be added to restricted use list\*

Book can be returned to general population\*

<sup>\*</sup> After completion and determination of the reviewing committee, a written recommendation will be given to the Superintendent for his/her decision (approval or denial). The School Board and the party bringing the concern will be informed in writing of the outcome. If requested a party may bring issue to the board for ultimate decision.
