AGENDA # 12B-5: COMMUNITY ACCESS FRAMEWORK AND FACILITIES PARTNERSHIP MODEL

This agenda item presents the Community Access Framework and Facilities Partnership Model, along with a corresponding Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between Kimberly School District and a Community Group, in the event the bond proposal is approved by voters.

As the Board has previously communicated its vision that potential bond-funded facilities would be available for community use when not needed for school purposes, there has been a request for additional detail regarding how that access would be structured should the bond pass. These documents provide that framework.

The Community Access Framework outlines the District’s intent to expand community access through potential new facilities, including a fieldhouse, auditorium, and athletic fields, while maintaining priority for student instruction, activities, and school-sponsored programs. It provides a structured and transparent approach for how such facilities would be made available to the community when not in use by the District.

The MOU establishes the operational structure for implementing this framework through a formal partnership with a Community Group. The Community Group will serve in a coordinating role to support equitable access for KYA, other Kimberly-based youth teams, and all Kimberly patrons through a consistent, District-managed scheduling process. The Community Group does not own, operate, or control District facilities.

Together, these documents provide clarity on how community access would be structured if the bond is approved and outline a framework for fair and transparent use of public facilities. The intent is to provide advance direction so the community understands how access would be organized should future facilities be constructed and operational.

This item also includes consideration of a companion communication to district patrons that outlines the District’s intent to review and update current facility use and scheduling practices to ensure equitable access for Kimberly-based and community groups, consistent with the principles described in the Community Access Framework.
