## Teacher Feedback

- Formative measures are used by teachers. They can go back and reteach and fill in gaps.
- Use SOS lessons to focus on emotional regulation when doing stressful tasks.
- Focus on growth, not just a number. Create class goals.
- Focus on a growth mindset... We may not be able to do it now, but we will be able to do it later.
- Have observed students that "didn't think they were capable of success on the ISAT perform amazing on the practice tests... It was fun to see their smiles".
- We also use weekly and unit tests. Teams meet to support each other in correcting student errors and misconceptions.
- A lot of collaboration is still needed especially on how to address more challenging math work.
- Teachers also use their assessments to collaborate with parents for additional understanding and practice.

- Test scores don't define us, but we should try our best.
- Testing is a part of many careers.
- Students rise to the standard that we expect of them.

- Students are learning to become independent learners.
- Students use study techniques that work for them.
- Students "ARE" doing hard things daily on classroom work and assignments within structure, routines, and accountability.
