

PSAT October 12 for Sophomores and Juniors

- The PSAT will be administered to (315) sophomores and juniors. This will require the use of at least 15 total classrooms.
- 13 rooms will be for general ed students, and 2 additional rooms will be needed for students needing accommodations for students who need the test read to them.
- There are 11 available rooms and the gym for the remaining (313) freshmen and seniors. There are 4 computer labs, but they do not work for all classes because of the expensive equipment in some labs.
- 13 sophomore and junior staff members will help proctor the PSAT, but a few freshmen or senior staff members are needed to cover the 15 classrooms.
- This creates a safety and staffing issue. Some rooms have 24 seats, but the class size might be 29-30 students. Some teachers may have to give up their prep time to cover a staff member who is proctoring.

KHS would like to request an online day for freshmen and seniors on Wednesday, October 12th

- All freshmen would have 4 classes that day. They would receive an online lesson that would require around 1 hour of work per class.
- All seniors would have anywhere from 2 to 4 classes that day. They would also receive an online lesson that would require around 1 hour of work per class
- The students taking the PSAT will finish around 12:15 and be offered a lunch in the cafeteria. Students who ride the bus will be transported home around 1 pm.
- The remainder of the day would allow teachers to work on curriculum alignment and complete the Essential Standards Chart.
