1.) Due to COVID, our spring assessment data was limited. However prior to COVID we used montly Istation testing, two Star Reading tests, and the Interim ISAT tests at the elementary schools and 7th grade to monitor growth and make instructional decisions. We have made great gains in improving assessment literacy and a stronger culture of accountability. Specifically, we've used this testing data to guide data-based collaboration meetings. Additionally, we have worked on improving our assessment-results communication with parents. 2.) Data prior to COVID indicated steady growth. In particular, Istation data showed a strong correlation with improved literacy in early grades. Through the use of the data, interventions were determined and offered to the students with the most need. These groups were formed and re-formed flexibily, based on assessment breakdowns and teacher collaboration conversations.
