## WHAT IS DUAL CREDIT

- DUAL CREDIT COURSES ARE THOSE COURSES TAKEN FOR COLLEGE CREDIT AND HIGH SCHOOL CREDIT,
   CONCURRENTLY.
  - AT KIMBERLY HIGH SCHOOL;
  - ON CSI'S CAMPUS;
  - ONLINE THROUGH IDLA (IDAHO DIGITAL LEARNING);
  - OTHER COLLEGES ALSO OFFER CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT ONLINE.

# WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO TAKE DUAL CREDIT

Dual credit courses are typically taken in the junior and senior year;

Students must have at least a 2.5 cumulative gpa (some courses require a 3.0);


Many courses have pre-requisites, in example, certain courses, certain test scores, etc.- students must meet them before enrollment.

# WHEN DO STUDENTS REGISTER FOR DUAL CREDIT COURSES?

- COURSES ARE REQUESTED THE SEMESTER BEFORE THEY ARE TAKEN;
- IF THE COURSE IS TO BE TAKEN AT KHS, TEACHERS WILL WORK WITH THE COUNSELING DEPARTMENT TO REGISTER STUDENTS:
- IF THE COURSE WILL BE TAKEN THROUGH IDLA, THE STUDENT NEEDS TO REQUEST THE COURSE A SEMESTER BEFORE THEY ARE TAKEN;
- IF THE COURSE WILL BE TAKEN AT CSI, THE STUDENT NEEDS TO REQUEST SEMINAR PERIODS IN THEIR HIGH SCHOOL SCHEDULE THE SEMESTER BEFORE THEY ARE TAKEN. THE STUDENT ALSO NEEDS TO WORK WITH THE CSI TRANSITION COORDINATOR TO CHOOSE THE TIME THE COURSE(S) WILL BE TAKEN.
- IF THE STUDENT ENROLLS IN A COURSE AT CSI, HE OR SHE MUST GIVE ALL COURSE INFORMATION TO THE OFFICE SO IT CAN BE RECORDED IN POWERSCHOOL.
- YEAR-LONG COURSES TAKEN AT KHS WILL BE REGISTERED FOR IN SEMESTER 2, HOWEVER, THE STUDENT NEEDS TO BE ENROLLED IN THE DUAL CREDIT SECTION ALL YEAR.

### HOW DO I REGISTER FOR DUAL CREDIT?

- YOU MUST APPLY TO BE A DUAL CREDIT STUDENT!
- ONCE APPROVED AS A DUAL CREDIT STUDENT, YOU WILL LOG INTO THE COLLEGE PORTAL AND ADD THE COURSE AND SECTION YOU WISH TO TAKE.
- IF THE COURSE IS TO BE TAKEN AT CSI, YOU MUST COMPLETE AN ADD/DROP FORM TO BE TURNED IN TO CSI (KHS DOES NOT DO THIS FOR YOU!).
- IF THE COURSE IS TO BE TAKEN THROUGH IDLA, MISS ROGERS WILL HELP YOU ENROLL IN THE COURSE.

## HOW MUCH ARE THE COURSESP

- ADVANCED OPPORTUNITIES PAYS FOR DUAL CREDIT COURSES
- IF A STUDENT FAILS A COURSE THAT HAS BEEN PAID FOR BY ADVANCED OPPORTUNITY FUNDING, THE FUNDS MUST BE REIMBURSED TO THE SCHOOL BEFORE YOU CAN REGISTER FOR ANOTHER COURSE.
- ANY COURSES THAT USE ADVANCED OPPORTUNITY FUNDS MUST APPEAR ON THE HIGH SCHOOL TRANSCRIPT.
- IF THE STUDENT IS PLANNING ON TAKING COURSES ON CSI'S CAMPUS, ADVANCED OPPORTUNITY FUNDS PAY FOR \$75 PER CREDIT AND THE STUDENT MUST PAY THE BALANCE OUT-OF-POCKET. FUNDS NEEDS TO BE PAID TO CSI BY THE TUITION DEADLINE. (TYPICALLY THE 1ST FRIDAY OF THE OPENING WEEK OF CLASSES.)



"Students attending public school in Idaho will be eligible for \$4,125.00 to use towards overload courses, dual credits, college credit-bearing examinations and professional certification examinations." (Idaho Code 33-4602)

Fast Forward Participation Form

This participation form allows students to participate in the Fast Forward program through the Idaho State Department of Education as authorized by Idaho Code 33, Chapter 46. Advanced Opportunities. By signing this form, the student and parent/guardian agree to the conditions and provisions of the program.

Students are allocated a total of 44,125.00 to use in grades 7-12. Funds can be used towards:

- Overload courses; high school credits taken in access of the 12 credits and outside of the regular school day, offered by the public high school, up to \$225.00 per course. Eligibility varies by student.
- Dual credits; a maximum of \$75.00 per credit

 Examinations; Advanced Placement, International Baccalaureate, College Level Examination Program, Professional Technical

Students should meet with their guidance counselor to develop a 4, 5, or 6 year learning plan that will help them maximize this benefits of this program according to the student's college and career interests. Intentional selection of coursework is a critical element of these programs. Student who use Fast Forward funds for toward more than 15 college credits, must receive post-secondary advising before accessing more funds.

All courses paid for by Fast Forward must be transcribed on the student's public high school transcript.

The parent/student understands that he/she will be held responsible for tuition and fees incurred as a result of participation in courses or exams taken from a college/university or other provider, and will be responsible for complying with policies and procedures set forth by the provider.

The Idaho State Department of Education will send payment for courses to the public Idaho post-secondary institution or the student's school district. Eligibility for payment is subject to the deadlines and procedures set forth by local school district in advanced Opportunities portal according to district guidelines. The parent/students is responsible for any fees that are not processed through the portal.

If a student fails to earn credit for a course paid for by Fast Forward, the student must subsequently pay for a "like" course on their own before he/she is eligible for further Fast Forward funding. If a student performs inadequately on an examination paid for by Fast Forward, the local school district will decide whether the student may continue utilizing Fast Forward funding, or if she/he must pay for the cost of a "like" examination before using further funds. Fast Forward funds may not be used for repeated or remedial course work.

With the approval of the school district students can track expenditures of their allocation by creating an account in the Advanced Opportunities portal.

- KHS OFFERS 50 CREDITS THAT CAN BE USED TO MEET THE CERTIFICATE REQUIREMENTS IN VARIOUS AREAS,
  HOWEVER, STUDENTS MUST GO TO CAMPUS FOR ENGLISH 102, ONE SCIENCE COURSE AND A GENERAL ED COURSE
  (THESE MAY BE OFFERED ONLINE, AS WELL).
