What is the cost for IDLA courses? Elementary Program K-6: \$60.00 per semester. Fee is nonrefundable and must be paid prior to student being registered. Payment can be made at the district office with cash or check only. Secondary Program 7-12: Depends on courses being taken (maximum of \$75 per course). IDLA is in the process of developing a fee schedule. Fee is nonrefundable and must be paid prior to student being registered. Payment can be made at the district office with cash or check only.
Is there a limit to the number of students who can be enrolled in IDLA? Elementary Program K-6: 35 seats have been reserved for KSD Secondary Program 7-12: No limit

Are there funds that are available to pay for the cost of IDLA courses for my child? Advanced Opportunities funding is available for students in grades 7-12 for overload and dual credit courses. Need based scholarships may be available for all grade levels. Please contact your local school's site coordinator for more information.

> Can I switch my child between IDLA and Kimberly School District?

Students may enroll with KSD at any time. If transferring from IDLA to KSD during the semester, IDLA grades will transfer with the student and be factored into the final semester grade. Once a student transfers out of IDLA, he/she cannot enroll in IDLA again until the next semester. Students wanting to transfer from KSD to IDLA must do so during the specified enrollment period for IDLA.

> Will a device be provided for my child?

Devices will be provided for students enrolled with KSD. Students enrolled with IDLA may be provided devices by KSD on a limited basis per family.

> Will internet access be provided for my child?

Families who need assistance with internet access should contact the local school's Site Coordinator.

> What are parent responsibilities for IDLA course?

Elementary Program K-6:

- Complete a synchronous (specified time) orientation course prior to students gaining access to course materials.
- Log your students in each day or ensure they can log in on their own.
- Assist students with navigation and learning support as needed.
- Communicate frequently with your child's IDLA teacher.

Secondary Program 7-12:

- Use the <u>Technology Readiness Checklist</u> to ensure your home operating system meets minimum requirements for class access.
- Monitor your student's progress
 - Bi-weekly progress reports sent to parent email address
 - Create a Parent Portal log in (directions sent to parent email following registration). This will give you access to your student's class and grades.
 - Contact your student's IDLA teacher with questions.
- Communicate with your local school's Site Coordinator

> What is the scheduling/time commitments for IDLA?

Elementary Program – Depending on grade level, 30 to 60 minutes of synchronous (specific time for online face to face instruction) learning per day is required.
