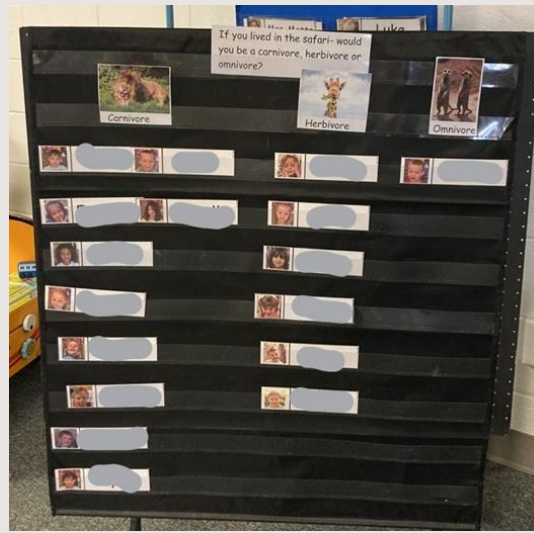


About Kimberly Preschool:

- + KPS holds Child Find screenings monthly
 - + This year, 44 children were screened
 - + 17 of those 44 students were identified as eligible for special education
 - + On average, 2-4 students per year make sufficient gains and can be exited from special education before they transition to kindergarten
- + KPS connects with families using Seesaw
 - + Each student gets 2-3 pictures/videos sent to their account each day, showing what they are doing in preschool
 - + Parents/guardians get newsletters through Seesaw, including activities families can do with their child to expand learning at home
 - + Parents/guardians can ask the staff questions through Seesaw, such as how to work with their child to prepare them for kindergarten

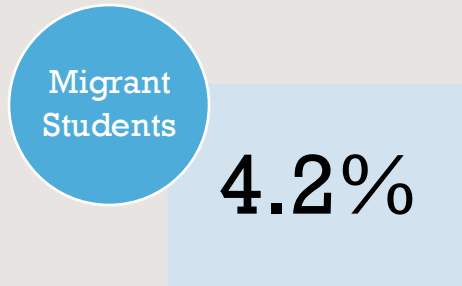
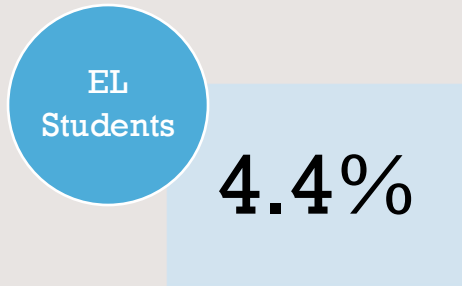
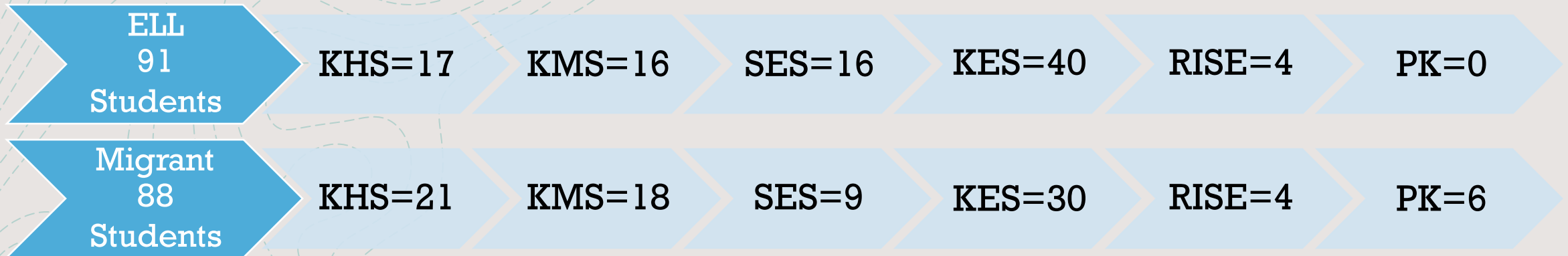

- + Graduation requirements for students who come to us in secondary with little to no English

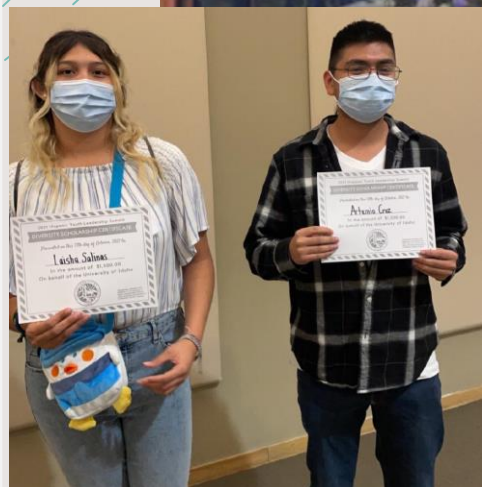

Migrant Summer School FY21

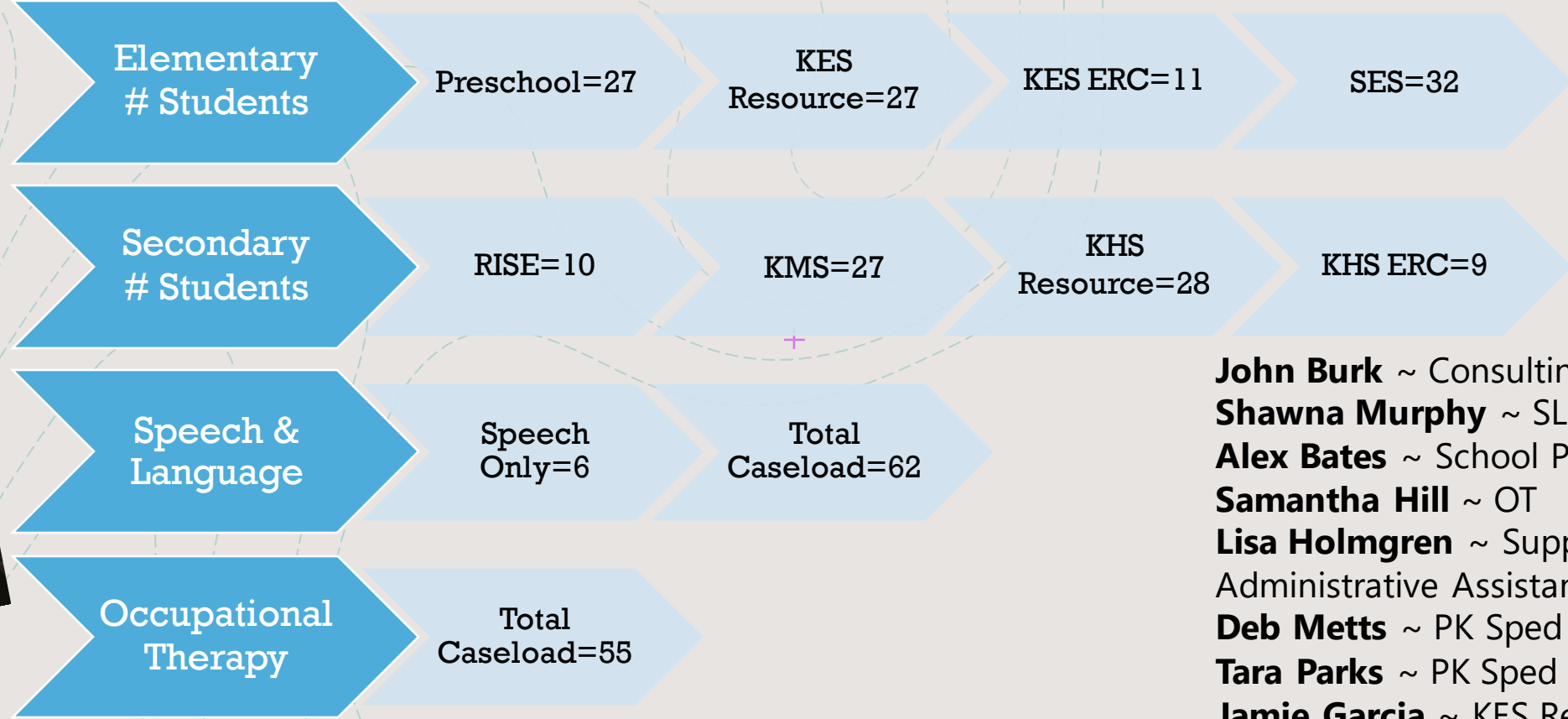


Migrant & ELL students attended the Hispanic Youth Leadership Summits at ISU, BSU, and CSI. A number of our students were awarded college scholarships!

- Finding dedicated space in each building for related service providers
- Strengthening Rtl to prevent premature referrals for special education
- High caseloads for our SLP and OT, and having one provider cover 6 locations
- Increased need for an effective behavior program
- Need for ERC program at KMS
- Turn-over of our classified staff

Changes...

- We have opened the position for a new resource teacher at Stricker for FY23
- Ludean Henderson will take over as SPED Director and preschool administrator for FY23
