

Kimberly Preschool FY22



About Kimberly Preschool:

KPS holds Child Find screenings monthly

- + This year, 44 children were screened
- 17 of those 44 students were identified as eligible for special education
- + On average, 2-4 students per year make sufficient gains and can be exited from special education before they transition to kindergarten

+KPS connects with families using Seesaw

- + Each student gets 2-3 pictures/videos sent to their account each day, showing what they are doing in preschool
- + Parents/guardians get newsletters through Seesaw, including activities families can do with their child to expand learning at home
- + Parents/guardians can ask the staff questions through Seesaw, such as how to work with their child to prepare them for kindergarten



The team traveled to San Antonio, TX for the National Migrant Conference in April.






Migrant Summer School FY21
