Transportation Protocol 2020-2021

- Drivers should practice all safety actions and protocols as indicated for other staff (e.g., hand hygiene, face coverings, staying home when ill/exposed to COVID-19).
- Provide hand sanitizer for students and bus drivers.
- Clean and disinfect school buses or other transport vehicles after each use according to CDC guidelines. See guidelines at https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/prepare/disinfectingbuilding-facility.html
 - Cleaning products should not be used near children.
 - Wear gloves, maintain adequate ventilation and follow manufacture guidelines for use of cleaners and disinfectants.
 - Air out and deep clean bus when not in use.
 - Cleaning products used while cleaning bus:
 - 1. Bright Solutions HP 202 (Hydrogen Peroxide based)
 - 2. DMQ EPA Reg.no. 5741-20
 - Create social distance on school buses, when feasible
 - Have members of same household sit together
 - Stagger seating and/or skip a row between families or individual students, when feasible.
 - Students/staff are to wear a face covering over mouth and nose on the bus as social distancing will be difficult to maintain.
 - If feasible, consider assigning seats from rear to front in order of pick-up/drop-off. This limits the number of people they walk past in order to get to their seat.
 - Open windows on bus, weather permitting, unless it poses an increased health risk such as triggering asthma symptoms.
